

NOTICE OF NONDISCRIMINATION

The Office of the Governor (OOG) complies with federal civil rights laws and is committed to ensuring that federal subrecipient programs, activities, and services originating from the U.S. Department of Justice operate without discrimination in accordance with:

- *Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964*, which prohibits discrimination based on race, color, or national origin (including language).
- Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, which prohibits discrimination based on disability.
- Titles I, II, and III of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, which prohibit discrimination based on disability.
- *Title IX of the Education Amendments Act of 1972*, which prohibits discrimination based on sex in education programs or activities.
- Age Discrimination Act of 1975, which prohibits discrimination based on age.
- Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968, which prohibits discrimination in the sale, rental, financing, and advertising of dwellings, on the basis of race, color, national origin, religion, disability, familial status, and sex.
- The Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968, which prohibits discrimination based on race, color, national origin, religion, or sex.
- Victims of Crime Act of 1984, which prohibits discrimination based on race, color, religion, national origin, handicap, or sex.
- Violence Against Women Act of 1994, which prohibits discrimination of the basis of actual or perceived race, color, religion, national origin, sex, gender identity, sexual orientation, or disability.
- U.S. Department of Justice regulation, Partnerships with Faith-Based and Other Neighborhood Organizations, which prohibits discrimination on the basis of religion in the delivery of services and prohibits organizations from using DOJ funding on explicitly religious activities (28 C.F.R. Part 38).

To File a Complaint

If you believe that the OOG and/or a federal subrecipient has discriminated in any way based on race, color, national origin (including language), disability, sex, or age, you can file a complaint with the <u>U.S. Department of Justice Office for Civil Rights (OCR) within the Office of Justice Programs (OJP):</u>
